

# SERIES WORKBOOK

Four Steps to Planning an Epic Series  
(for up to 18 book titles)



Potential Titles for the Series:

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### 1) What KIND of Series Is This?

- **Stand-Alone** (*individual novels; no concrete connections other than theme; no required reading order*)
- **Episodic** (*each novel follows a separate adventure but the same hero/heroine/family/team; little tidbits of character/backstory reveal spread throughout; suggested reading order*)
- **Saga** (*novels that follow a chronological sequence of events where the characters and subplots are all woven around the main story thread and the story builds on itself in each new novel; required reading order*)

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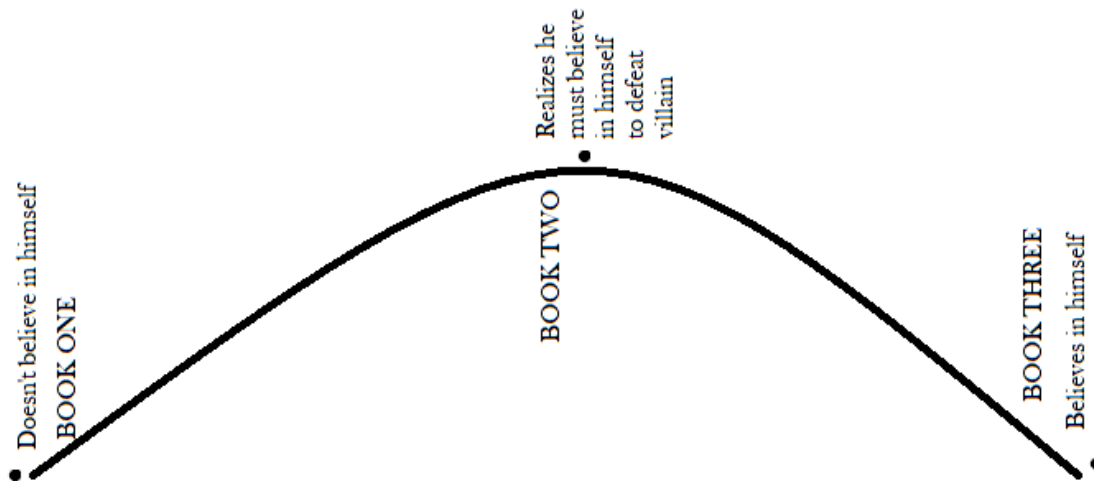
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#### 4) What is the Series Plot Structure? (Saga Only)

##### A - Character Arc

Draw an arch on a piece of paper (horizontal) and make three arrows across it - one at the beginning, one at the end, and one at the very middle/highest point. Using the middle point as the middle book of your series, fill in the rest of the arc with the remaining books in the series (or just use those three points if it's a trilogy). Now write down a one-sentence description for the character growth at the first point and the growth resolution at the last point. Fill in the remaining growth points/books with one-sentence descriptions that get the character to that resolution.



## B - Plot Arc

Use your favorite plotting structure/system to outline your series as you would outline a book. Give each book a specific purpose. (Goodbye, Bridge Book!)
